

The Unofficial Ft Lauderdale Guidebook for the Needy & Homeless

Welcome.

Fort Lauderdale is a City with a variety of gov't services, charities, church groups, and independent volunteers that offer aid to homeless and impoverished people. This is particularly true in downtown Fort Lauderdale which has the largest population of chronically homeless people in Broward County.

The 1st thing to know about homeless services in the area is that most shelters and other facilities are filled to capacity year round. Many needy people congregate in a few particular places downtown in part because its where regular and irregular aid & charity relief groups can connect with the needy.

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Homelessness & The Police

Homeless people are widely trespassed and sometimes arrested for minor offences in an effort to keep them away from valuable property in downtown Fort Lauderdale.

If you are arrested in downtown by the FLPD, you will generally be processed at the FLPD station and then held at the Jail/Courthouse complex until you make bail or see a magistrate. You may also be transferred to another BSO facility, all of which are in Pompano Beach.

There are a number of laws that pertain to the daily activities of homeless people, particularly in downtown Ft Lauderdale.

Trespassing affidavits are liberally used by public & private buildings downtown to keep homeless people away. **Trespassing** is perhaps one of the most common arrestable offences applied to homeless people downtown. **Panhandling, public urination, & camping/sleeping outdoors** are arrestable misdemeanors. There is also a law allowing police to confiscate and store property left in public spaces for storage.

There is also a law that criminalizes **food sharing** downtown. Its legality is being challenged in the court system and sharings currently continue.

Municipal bond courts currently do not provide attorneys for homeless people who are arrested for minor offences in Ft Lauderdale. The public defender's office is working for changes in the court system but currently is unable to represent municipal code offenders in most cases.

OBTAINING IDENTIFICATION

Birth Certificate – LifeNet 4 Families

An original birth certificate can be obtained by written request to the Bureau of Vital Statistics in the county where you were born. There is usually a fee for this service. To find the address and phone number of the Bureau of Vital Statistics for the county of your birth, look in the local library for the directory of the city in which you were born. You can also phone information for the telephone number. **Dial 1** (Area code of the birth county) **555.1212** and ask for the Bureau of Vital Statistics. This is usually a free call.

Social Security Card

U.S. citizens need a certified copy of their birth certificate or baptismal record. Non U.S. citizens need their birth certificate and legal papers, such as a passport, visa, green card or work authorization permit. No Photocopies allowed.



Identification Card

To get an identification card, you can apply for one at any driver's license office. You must:

- (a) be 12 years of age or older
- (b) present your official Social Security card
- (c) have two items of identification, one of which must list your full name and date of birth, and a second supporting document, such as: birth certificate, school record stating date of birth, baptismal certificate, family bible record, passport, Florida vehicle registration certificate, court order which includes name, voter registration card, marriage license or certificate, Florida or out-of-state driver license, military ID card
- (d) There is no fee for Florida homeless and you must present documentation of homelessness.

LifeNet4Families can assist persons experiencing homelessness obtain their birth Certificate and State of FL Identification card.

• The Mayor & City Commission creates many of the rules governing the treatment of homeless people in downtown, but few of the actual homeless services. There are public Commission meetings every 1st & 3rd Tuesday of the month at 6 pm at City Hall, 100 N Andrews Ave. There are a number of other advisory boards that handle issues downtown. • The FLPD enforces criminal laws against homeless people downtown. The City & downtown businesses also contract a number of private security employees.

• The Downtown Development Authority is a special district created to promote development and "combat urban blight." Their 7 member board, comprised mostly of large downtown property owners and developers, is appointed by the City Commission. They have a public meeting every 2nd Thursday of the month at 8:30 am at the Broward Center for the Performing Arts, 201 SW 5th Ave Broward County

• **Broward County Commission** is the major policymaker for the majority of services provided to homeless people in Ft Lauderdale. They meet every Tuesday morning at 10 am at the Governmental Center, 115 S Andrews Ave.

• **The Continuum of Care Board** is a 24 member advisory board to the County gov't for all homeless services. They have a public meeting every 4th Wednesday of the month at 10 am in the Governmental Center, 115 S Andrews Ave.

• **Broward Sheriff's Office** has a number of Homeless Outreach Deputies. Contact: Deputy Monica Jean, 954-831-8221
